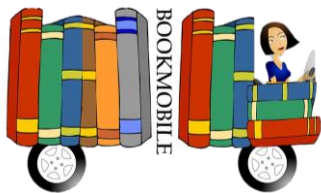

### Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry

By Mildred D. Taylor

Set in Mississippi at the height of the Depression, this is the story of one family's struggle to maintain their integrity, pride, and independence in the face of racism and social injustice. And it is also Cassie's story—Cassie Logan, an independent girl who discovers over the course of an important year why having land of their own is so crucial to the Logan family, even as she learns to draw strength from her own sense of dignity and self-respect.

Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry was written in 1977 by Mildred D. Taylor. It won the 1977 Newbery Medal. The novel is the first book in the Logan family saga, which includes four sequels and three prequels as well as two novellas.

Libby is completely free. It's free to install, and there are no subscription costs, no in-app purchases, and no late fees. Enjoy Libby on almost any device! Download the Libby app on a phone or tablet, access in a web browser (libbyapp.com), listen with Android Auto or Apple CarPlay, transfer to an eReader, and more.

All you need is a valid library card from your library and a pin or password to get started.
