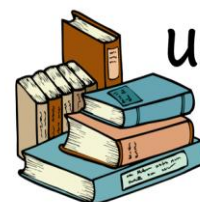

Libby is completely free. It is free to install, and there are no subscription costs, no in-app purchases, and no late fees. Enjoy Libby on almost any device! Download the Libby app on a phone or tablet, access in a web browser (libbyapp.com), listen with Android Auto or Apple CarPlay, transfer to an eReader, and more.

All you need is a valid library card from your library and a pin or password to get started.

### New Digital Newspaper Collection from NewsBank now Available

The Library now has a subscription to a new digital newspaper collection from NewsBank. This fully searchable collection provides online access to the complete electronic editions of the Idaho Statesman, The Oregonian, and USA Today newspapers. It is updated daily.

These collections include full-text news articles, editorials, reviews, birth and marriage announcements, obituaries, and a variety of special sections. Patrons can use this resource for general reference or to research local and national issues, events, people, government, education, arts, business, sports, real estate and much more.
