### How to get a Library Card

It is easy to get a library card. It only takes a few minutes.

Just drop by the library and sign-up.

A Library card gets you access to all library materials including DVDs, audio books, ebooks and other online content.

Individuals and/or families wishing to obtain an Ontario Community Library Card must provide the following:

- A current photo ID with address
- A personal contact – (the name, address, and phone number of an individual not living with you)
- Proof of residence with current address – (examples: Idaho Power bill, City Water bill, Cascade Gas bill, or Phone bill),
- If applicable, a check or cash for fees such as those for out of state or area cards.
- Parents wishing to register a child (0 to 17 years) will need to accompany their child.
- Applications available at the Front Desk.

You'll benefit greatly by carrying this card in your wallet. For more information about acquiring your own card, just call 541-889-6371 or stop by the library.
